### Old Granbury Road Lane Closure in Cresson

March 6, 2024

**Cresson** – Old Granbury Road will be reduced to one lane at the intersection with US 377 on weekdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. from Monday, March 11 – Friday, March 22 for paving work. Flaggers will direct traffic through the work zone.

TxDOT encourages attention to all warning signs within the work zone as crews complete this project as quickly and safely as possible.

## US 377 Lane Closures in Cresson

**CRESSON** – Various lanes of north and southbound US 377 will be closed as needed between Blanco Mesa Drive and Sliver Stone Drive from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. weekdays from Wednesday, March 6 – Friday, March 15 for lane marker updating. At least one lane will remain open in each direction during this work.
